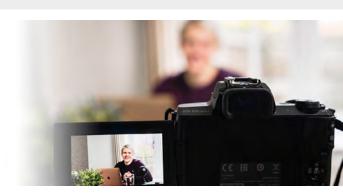

Canadian Workplace Culture and Communication

This 6-week course is for skilled immigrants looking to enter the Canadian labour market and is designed to equip you with the essential communication skills needed to succeed in a diverse and highly competitive professional Canadian workplace. The course focuses on key aspects of culture and communication such as understanding Canadian workplace culture rules and application of such rules for greater professional success, effective use of verbal and non-verbal forms of communication when interacting with colleagues and clients as well learning how to effectively receive, interpret and respond to feedback.

Enrollment Requirements:

- · Must have a valid Language Assessment CLB 4+
- Must be 18 years of age or older

Attend part-time or full-time. Clients who attend full-time and successfully complete both courses may be eligible for a non-paid work placement. All participants will be eligible for 1-on-1 job coaching.
